As a follow up to the phone call you received from our Administrator today, and in continuing our promise to remain transparent throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, please find information enclosed related to the surrounding facts of our Bayshore Place resident that has tested positive for COVID-19.

On the evening of July 6, 2020, during standard temperature and oxygen level checks, we found a resident with an elevated temperature. As a result, this resident was sent to the hospital and later diagnosed positive for COVID-19.

Immediately, this resident's air conditioning was turned off and the room was 'sealed' per CDC guidelines. This 'seal' will remain in place for 72 hours and post 72 hours, this resident's room will be sanitized.

It is important to note that through July 6, 2020, ALL residents and staff were asymptomatic.

Because this resident is someone who typically stays in their room, except for physical therapy utilization, the source of exposure should be minimal and is being traced. Fortunately, all our staff and our contracted therapy staff were tested on Thursday, July 2, 2020. These test results are pending and should prove pivotal in assessing source of exposure. The therapy room is closed pending completion of a full deep sanitation. Bayshore Place has also undergone a full sanitation.

We have contacted the Department of Health and are currently in process of requesting COVID-19 test kits for our Bayshore Place residents. Until these tests are conducted and results received, we are having our residents remain in their rooms. We will continue to provide all necessary services to your loved one and have increased our scheduled temperature and oxygen level checks to twice per shift. Our staff will also engage each resident in a series of questions to determine their clinical status.

In addition to the above, we will also be re-testing our Bayshore Place team members.

Again, the health and safety of all residents and staff remains our top priority. We will continue to keep you informed as we work through this process. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us.
